Friday 24th of June:

Arrival at Atholl Palace, rally/hotel check-in!

Saturday 25th:

You can lunch at the “Old Kitchen Restaurant”, stroll around the premises and enjoy your afternoon....

Sunday 26th:

LOCH NESS! (after Good Morning Darryl) – an early start and a bit longer run – 2 hours along the Highlands breathtaking view of Loch Ness.

Arriving at Fort Augustus (Canalside, Fort Augustus, PH32 4BN).

Refreshments are served onboard, but if you like to take lunch after the cruise, there are a few pubs in town like “The Boathouse” or “The Lock Inn”, both 5 min walk from the boatdock. In due course make your way back to Atholl Palace for our usual drinks, dinner and entertainment!

BALMORAL!

After breakfast (Good Morning Darryl!), make your way to see the Queen! ...well, at least her summer residence – a large estate house. Balmoral – once a hunting lodge for King Robert II of Scotland (1316 -1390). Now in “modern times” the residence for members of the Royal family. - though called a castle, it is now a country house from the Victorian period.

On route to Balmoral you will pass through the village of Kirkmichael – the premises of Milford Vintage Engineering – where Sara and Ian with staff can help you, should you have any car problems – (they may also have some delicious cakes/tea and coffee to offer!)

Don’t linger too long- on your route to Balmoral you will have a scenic drive through the Cairngorms National Park - try to arrive in good time to park/get your admission tickets for visiting and look around the house/gardens, etc. Lunch can be taken in the “Pipers Hall Café”.

In your own time, make your way back to Atholl Palace for refreshing aperitifs, dinner and entertainment!

Wednesday 29th;

BLAIR ATHOLL CASTLE (The White Castle) and the House of Bruar!

A leisurely day – a shorter drive to Blair Atholl Castle – The White Castle -, 6 miles from Pitlochry.

Heavy loaded with 700 years of history, earliest known from 1269! A place of 19 generations of the Stewarts and the Murrays of Atholl! The only place in Europe with a private army – The Atholl Highlanders – once founded to protect Queen Victoria during her stays.

Lunch can be taken at the “Tullbardine Restaurant”.

Leaving Blair Atholl Palace, in your own time, make a stop at the “Queens View” – fantastic scenery over Loch Tummel – said to be named after Robert the Bruce’ wife Isabel!

You are now free to visit and enjoy “The Harrods of the North” – the House of Bruar!

Home of country clothing, Scottish food and drink and so much more.....

Back at base, we have our last aperitif before dinner and “Farewell night”!

A night with Scottish flavour and a traditional Piper to escort the Haggis – followed by wild Scottish dancing!
